Pastor's Message



Outside the glass front doors of my house, there's a robin pecking at worms; the crab apple tree has exploded in pink glory; the lilac bushes are filling the air with color and sweet scent. As I was writing, I heard a knock at the window, a not-very-rhythmic "ponk, . . . ponk, ponk," like a small bird flying into the glass. Turns out it was a bumble-bee, big as a small bird or nearly. I wonder if he's trying to get in, or if he's just trying to get that other bumble-bee, the one that keeps mocking his every movement, to go away and leave him alone.

The second Sunday of June is Pentecost, the day the Spirit of God poured into a small group of folks who were gathered in Jesus' name and turned their lives upside down. Under the powerful influence of the Spirit, they spoke and acted in new, exciting ways. Their odd behavior attracted the people around them to come and see what was going on and before the day was over their community had grown beyond their wildest dreams. The Spirit of God gave them new joy and power, and a new set of challenges, too. As their neighbors responded to the Spirit in their midst, they found themselves facing a new set of physical and spiritual needs.

The church offices are upside-down. Pat and I are working upstairs in the Ladies' Parlor (thank you, ladies, for your hospitality) while the office and entry area downstairs is being converted into space that is welcoming for everyone. When the dust clears, our building will be fully accessible for people who use wheelchairs and walkers. It's a very good design. I'm looking forward to watching as it takes form.

The Council and the Deacons are planning a retreat to follow up on our winter class "Choosing Life: the Way to a Thriving Church." In those class meetings, we shared our ideas, dreams, concerns and hopes for the church. Among other things, I heard us agreeing that we want to find ways of reaching out to our community with visible, effective acts of compassion; and I heard that we want to explore some new forms of worship—worship that is creative and joyful, accessible, filled with hope and praise. Many of us sensed that a new and promising vision was emerging from our conversations; and now, with the help of a facilitator, Nancy Brown, we're going to be taking the next steps toward helping this emerging vision take form. If you have thoughts you'd like to make sure we consider as we go forward with this retreat, please talk with a member of the Council, a Deacon or with me. We'd love to hear your thoughts.

The bumble-bee outside my window appears to have worked things out with his rival in the glass. The lilacs and the crab-apple tree are still bursting with color. The Spirit of God! The Spirit of God is touching the world with hope, with life, with overwhelming joy. Even the humans are busy preparing themselves for the coming newness. And that is the surest sign of all that the Spirit of God, the Spirit of God is truly at play in the world.

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN PHASE II ASSESIBILITY PROJECT BEGINS

On May 15th at a special congregational meeting, Phil Krill and Eric Pospesil presented the plans developed over the last few months for the accessibility project in Phase II of the Capital Campaign. Members present voted to proceed with the plan as presented with Phil, Eric, the Property Committee, Ann Craxton and Wilma Weddington serving as a special task force to oversee the project to completion. Any member who has seen the plans and has suggestions or comments are invited to put them in the Property Committee mail box or leave them in the church office for the members of this special task force. The project, managed by the Lawton Company of Littleton, also includes installation of two additional ADA compliant rest rooms and a closed walkway. \$30,000 in additional funds are needed to complete the project and anyone who did not give to the Capital Campaign or who can find it in their heart to give a little more is encouraged to do so now. Completion is expected to be the end of August. The entire church facility will become accessible to everyone who enters.

Starting May 23rd, the center entry to the current church offices will be closed for the installation of a lift which will access three levels of the church - street, office/fellowship hall, and sanctuary/Christian education/ladies parlor. During the renovation period, the church offices will be relocated to the Ladies Parlor and can be accessed by the steps on the west side of the current office entrance. Organizations who meet in the Fellowship Hall can enter via the walkway between the east side of the church and the Social Security office. Appropriate signs will be posted outside the church. The Shining Lights Learning Center will continue to be accessed through their current entrance without interruption. As always, please join us in Sunday worship service at 10:00 am with Sunday school continuing through June 12th.

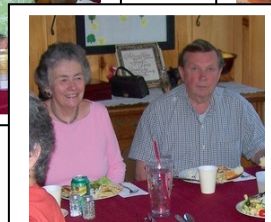

Church Council Meeting Summary

Church Council met on May 17th and opened with devotions read by Dudley Bailey "When you pray to God, God quiets the heavens". Minutes from the April meeting were approved.

Pastor David had been attending the North Country Association meetings with our delegates. The meeting in September will be hosted by our church on Friday, September 16th and will be responsible for providing a pot luck supper. Rev. Barry Jacobson will be installed as pastor of the Franconia Community Church on June 5th at 3:30 PM and all are invited to attend. Pastor David has continued his visitation and involvement with the clergy group of this area. The clergy are exploring the idea of continued mid-week ecumenical services.

Property - Art Hunt said that the annual clean-up day is May 21st - Because of the new construction to take place help will be needed to move Pat, David, and Dottie's offices. Pat and David will be moving to the Ladies Parlor. Art also mentioned that SLLC will be installing new windows in the school area and may be interested in including the windows in the ladies bathroom. The rate and fee schedule was handed out that was dated July 22, 2009. Property will update this at their next meeting and bring back to council for approval.

Summary of the Special Congregational Meeting: 42 people attended this meeting and the congregation unanimously approved the Phase II accessibility project which will start the week of May 23rd. Next steps will be to move offices, post signage for temporary access, and alert groups that use our building. Expected completion is by the end of August.

Filling vacancies on committees between annual meetings: The council approved the motion that if there is a vacancy to be filled on a committee between annual meetings, the church member nominated by the chair of the committee will need to be approved by the council as this is in keeping with intent of the By-Laws. The By-Laws will be followed as to criteria for serving on committees at this time. If a non-member wishes to volunteer for a committee, they may as a non-voting member. This will also be subject to council approval.

Shining Lights: Alice Muh reported that SLLC is putting all new windows which will be much more energy efficient and will be of tempered glass.

Music: Tina Peabody stated that hanging over the janitor's closet there is a piece to the old pump organ

that was once used in our church which they would like to refinish and put a plaque on. This would be paid for with some of the Haynes memorial money.

Personnel: Judy Warden reported that the new new job descriptions for Sexton, Music Director and Administrative Assistant are now available and will be added the Operations Manual. It was noted that the duties of the Clerk (a volunteer position that has been eliminated) have been added to the Administrative Assistant's description. Alice Muh requested that the Personnel Committee make sure there is a full copy of the Operations Manual on the church computer,

Finance: Audit results still pending. On-line file back up system has been installed on Pat Whipple's computer. Discussion about how to manage budget overages took place. Extraordinary expenses and allocation of funds needs to come to Council for approval. Discussed whether unexpected organ repairs should be included in Property Committee budget or Music . This item will go back to Finance for further discussion.

Christian Ed: Linda Warden said the committee is working on instituting a nursery program for the very young children of the church so their parents may attend church. Sunday School ends for the year on June 12th. Celebration Sunday is May 22.

Deacons: The deacons are working on their outreach program and Ann Craxton raised up the work Barbara Holland, Mary Menzies, Glenda Iles have been getting this going. They are coordinating this with Pastor David and the prayer group. Please make sure that you encourage people to pass the pew register and to greet new people.

Leaders Retreat: Ann Craxton has contacted multiple facilitators and all charge significant fees. The money is not in the budget, but council agreed to proceed holding this process in our prayers and having faith that they will be able to find the money. A facilitator is key to having this process succeed. Nancy Brown who presented at church last fall is available and has agreed to work with us. The retreat will be held on June 25th at the Highland Center in Crawford notch. Alice Muh, moderator, Ann Craxton, chair of Deacons, and Pastor David will work with Nancy to set up the agenda and program. Deacons have been invited to attend as well.
