Responsive Reading based on Mark 11:1-10

One: As we approached Jerusalem, a crowd began to gather.

All: Blessed . . .

One: Jesus sent two of us into a village. “There you will find a donkey colt.

Bring it. If anyone asks, just say ‘Jesus needs it.’”

All: Blessed is the One . . .

One: We found the colt tied near a doorway. As we untied it, a bystander asked, “What are you doing with that colt?”

All: Blessed is the One who comes . . .

One: We told them “Jesus needs it.” They let us take it.

All: Blessed is the One who comes in the Name . . .

One: We threw our cloaks across its back and Jesus rode into the city. Some people spread their cloaks on the road while others spread leafy branches they’d cut in the fields. And all the while, the growing crowd was shouting:

**All: Hosanna! Blessed! Blessed is he who comes in the name of our God!
Hosanna! Blessed! Blessed is he! Hosanna in the highest!”**
